### **Kursbeschreibung:**

This course will introduce students to topics in International Relations, subfield International Political Economy (IPE) and International Organizations (IO). The focus will be on trade, money, finance, and immigration. Students are expected to learn key theoretical explanations of IPE especially problems of coordination and commitment, the prisoner's dilemma, and other simple game theoretic tools as well as a study of how institutions may (or may not) solve many of these problems. Finally, students will also learn the main empirical strategies used to test modern theories in IPE. Course is taught in English.
