Kursbeschreibung:

Due to the broad availability of information and communication technologies (ITC) individuals as well as organizations can easily sustain transnational links today. In this seminar we will explore the relationship between such transnational networks and various forms of resistance. The aim is, to learn more about the networked interaction between national and/or transnational political actors and organizations. The forms of resistance can be open, as in the case of transnational social movements, or clandestine, as in the case of terrorist and criminal organizations. By studying such diverse cases, students will gain a deeper understanding of the actors and structures of such networks and how they are built and maintained. In addition social network analysis as a method is introduced in this seminar.
