### **Kursbeschreibung:**

This course aims to equip students with an in-depth understanding of transnational terrorism. We will discuss how such clandestine networks are built and maintained by national and/or transnational actors. In detail the role of information and communication technologies, criminal organizations and the state will be critically assessed. By introducing diverse cases, students will gain insight into the actors and structures of such networks and their impact on strategies, tactics and cooperation.

With regard to the final paper, various methodological approaches, both qualitative and quantitative, will be introduced. This seminar aims to prepare students intensively for writing their final paper.

### **Course requirements and assessment:**

Students' regular attendance and active class participation (including acting as a discussant) are required as well as a presentation and a research paper (all in English).
