### **Kursbeschreibung:**

In this seminar, we will cover various forms of resistance such as protest, rebellion, civil war and terrorism. Focusing on non-democratic states the aim is to explain why actors choose violent or non-violent strategies to reach their aims. The analysis will focus on the strategic interaction between national and/or transnational actors to explain these forms of resistance. Various methodological approaches, both qualitative and quantitative, will be introduced with regard to the final paper. This seminar aims to prepare students intensively for writing their final paper.

Course requirements and assessment:

Students' regular attendance and active class participation (including acting as a discussant) are required as well as a presentation and a research paper (all in English).
